Stuff the Bus School Supply Drive

Each year, a handful of McFarland community organizations and businesses (including the McFarland Lions, the Lioness Lions, the American Legion Auxiliary, One Community Bank, Nelson Bus Service, and the McFarland School District) work together to conduct a 'Stuff the Bus' campaign.

Stuff the Bus is an effort to encourage community members to donate backpacks and school supplies for low-income students in the McFarland School District, to help them deal with the expenses of the new school year. After the campaign is completed, the backpacks with school supplies are then given to children of families served by the McFarland Food Pantry (which serves the school district population).

This year's Stuff the Bus campaign runs between July 27 and Saturday, August 10. If you wish to donate backpacks or school supplies, you can drop them off at the donation box located by the office of McFarland Lutheran Church now through Sunday, August 11. Or you can drop them off in the donation boxes at the village municipal center, the McFarland Library, or McFarland Pick 'N Save between July 27 and August 10. You can also drop donations off at the high school (main entrance) between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. on Saturday, August 10. If you wish to make a cash donation, you can send a donation to the McFarland Community Food Pantry (specify 'Stuff the Bus on the memo line of your check), PO Box 101, McFarland WI 53558, or donate online at https://mcfarlandfoodpantry.org/monetary donations/ (using PayPal or Venmo), and specify 'Stuff the Bus' in a comment.

School supplies needed: themed backpacks (grades K-5); sturdy backpacks (grades 6-12); Kleenex; black Expo dry erase markers; Notebooks (college-ruled, 1-subject); #2 wood pencils (sharpened); binder dividers; whiteboard erasers; white 1-inch 3-ring binders; yellow highlighters; yellow Post-It notes; composition notebooks (wide-ruled); felt-tip pens; pocket calculators; and Ziploc bags (gallon size).

Puerto Rico Missions / Exploratory Group

Many of you have asked if there was a plan to restart Puerto Rico mission trips. These were trips with about 24 individuals, roughly equally split between youth and adults. With a change in the availability of the camp where we stayed and the Covid pandemic, it has been a few years since the last trip. The Global Mission committee and Youth Ministries would like to explore the possibility of restarting these trips. We want to form an exploratory group to investigate possibilities, considering factors such as where the group would stay, work projects, youth engagement, cost, and others. Ideally the group would consist of past trip participants, especially young people, plus to get some new perspectives, individuals who have not been on a P.R. mission trip.
